Interpreting For People Living With Dementia ***Interactive Professional Development Workshop***

The incidence of dementia in CaLD communities is predicted to increase in the next few decades so it's likely that you will be required to interpret for a person with dementia and his/her family. In this two hour interactive workshop Heather Thorne, Project Officer – Multicultural Communities at Alzheimer's WA – will give an overview of dementia and how it affects the individual especially in relation to communication. There will also be an opportunity to analyse realistic scenarios in small groups and ask the presenter questions.
